


## Two double delights for Sheepcote

Beth did her winning the hard way. Second to go in the elementary, the rain started with a vengeance as she set off down the centre line.

"I have never been so wet," she said. "But luckily I came prepared and brought a complete change of clothes, except for the hat and boots — which were sodden. It was a very long day and a very

long wait [to see if I had won], but well worth it."

Beth bought Delight — a halfsister to Sandmartin's sire Wurlizer — as a yearling.

"I've always bought them as youngsters and brought them on and sold them, but now I have a proper job I'm hoping to keep this one," said Beth, who works on a co-operative fruit farm helping with its schools projects.

Lucy Pincus added her two wins to last year's novice restricted title with Sandmartin.

"His medium trots have really improved in the past few days and his balance is much better this year," said Lucy, who is planning to take the nine-year-old to the area festivals at medium, then work on his changes over the winter.
